What this will involve

You might be asked for an interview, or invited to take part in a workshop for sharing and extending our findings. Interviews will typically take place online and will be transcribed using an A.I. programme that will help us hide your identity if you wish. For re-doing interview questions, these were previously approved by the NHS (their reference 270126). Workshops will run either at the University of Sussex, or at another licensed charitable location. If you would like to take part you will need to sign a consent form (dated August 2023), detailing your permission, and including a question on whether or not you are willing to be identified to others beyond the day itself.
